

SAYS FAITH CURED TWO

Vicar at Trinity Chapel Tells of Healer Hickson's Work

The five days' healing mission conducted by James Moore Hickson, a layman of the Church of England, came to a close yesterday in Trinity Episcopal Chapel, Twenty-fifth Street, west of Broadway, when 1400 afflicted men, women and children were treated. Many came in wheel chairs.

The Rev. Joseph 'Wilson Sutton, Vicar of the chapel, stated last evening that a woman was instantaneously cured of lameness while Mr. Hickson had his hand on her head, and was praying over her. Mr. Sutton said that she hobbled up using two crutches, but that she walked from the church without using either crutch. Mr. Sutton did not know her name, as no effort was made to take the names of those who came to the church. The vicar said, also, that a young man had been cured of orthopedic trouble. Mr. Sutton said the young man had been helped the day before and went to his doctor to report. The young man announced yesterday that his doctor had pronounced him almost completely well.

Bishop Arthur S. Lloyd stood the entire morning next to Mr. Hickson and blessed each person as they left the heater. Next week Mr. Hickson will conduct healing missions in two Episcopal churches in Brooklyn.
