**Johnson And Richey Drawing
Great Crowds To Brown Tent**

Another great crowd was present last night to greet Floyd B. Johnson, the original radio "Sunshine Man" of Chicago, who drove in from Minneapolis to join Raymond T. Richey at the Big Tent at Pennsylvania and South Water street. The evangelistic campaign with these two men, is now under full head of steam and from the enthusiasm manifested last night by both the evangelists and the audience, promises to be a campaign of great interest.

Both Richey and Johnson spoke last night. A rousing song service directed by Mr. Johnson, after which he sang several solos was the opening feature of the meeting. After Mr. Richey's message, several people responded to his invitation to surrender to Christ.

Two services daily are scheduled for the remainder of this week, 10:30 a. m. and 7:45 p. m. Both evangelists will appear at all services.

Mrs. Richey and Mrs. Johnson, with their children, Rae Marie Richey and Ruth Lorraine Johnson, arrived with Mr. Johnson in Sheboygan and were introduced to the audience Tuesday night. Rae Marie, who is five years old, sang for the crowd.

Mr. and Mrs. Johnson, together with their pianist, Mary Jean Miller, will be heard in a daily feature broadcast at 6:45 p. m. over WHEL.

Great Musical Program Is Feature At Big Brown Tent

Speaking and singing before a capacity crowd at the Big Tent on Pennsylvania and Water streets, Raymond T. Richey and Floyd B. Johnson last night were rewarded for their efforts when they saw between sixty and seventy-five persons respond to the invitation to accept Christ.

The Rev. Mr. Fokkier of Milwaukee, together with his soloist, Mr. Buffet, were guests at the big tent last night, and both were heard during the service. Mrs. Floyd B. Johnson, who possesses a very charming contralto voice, and who appears with her husband each evening during the "sunset vesper hour" over WHBL, sang a request number with Mr. Johnson, "God is Still on the Throne." Miss Mary Jean Miller, instrumentalist, also delighted the great audience with numbers on her organ-chimes, marimbasphone and piano-accordion. An unusual program of music was a feature of last night's service.

Raymond T. Richey, whose special gift of faith has brought miraculous results in praying for the sick, last night prayed for a large number who came forward requesting prayer for their bodies. One person who came to the meeting on a cane, walked away without it. Others who had been deaf for years, claimed that they were able to hear after being prayed for. Mr. Richey extended an invitation to all who de-

sired prayer for physical ailments.

An enthusiastic song service was directed by Floyd B. Johnson, the "Sunshine Man" whose daily programs are now a feature over WHBL.

Afternoon services, it was announced, have been discontinued, and a morning service at 10:30 o'clock is now being held instead. No Sunday morning service will be conducted, but the Sunday schedule at the big tent calls for a meeting at 2:30 p. m. and 7:30 p. m., which will be Mr. Richey's final appearances here.
