

## EVANGELIST WILL HOLD MEETING AT TITUSVILLE SUNDAY

Campaign Will Start After An Open Invitation of Two Years Standing; Raymond T. Richey Is Well Known

HOUSTON, Tex., Aug. 11.— (Special) — Raymond T. Richey, widely known evangelist, accompanied by his celebrated party of soul-winners, is scheduled to launch an old-time revival and gospel of healing meeting at Titusville, Pa., next Sunday night, Aug. 14. This campaign, which comes after an invitation that has been kept alive for two years, and which is sponsored by a number of representative citizens of Titusville, including, of course, church folk, will be conducted in a mammoth tent pitched downtown.

E. A. Edwards of Titusville is a long-time friend and admirer of Mr. Richey. Mr. Edwards is one of thirteen divisional trustees of the Houston Evangelistic Temple, an interdenominational, non-sectarian missionary and evangelistic enterprise founded by the evangelist.

The Titusville meeting just announced will be the first to be conducted by Mr. Richey in Northern Pennsylvania, though he has been heard by many Northern Pennsylvania folk in Florida. The Houston evangelist has come to be known and loved by thousands of northern people, who have never seen him in the North, as the "tourists' evangelist". Mr. Richey preaches to vast audiences, largely made up of tourists, in Florida every winter. It is expected his Titusville meet-

ing will draw many persons from New York state. Mr. Richey held a great revival in Pittsburgh several years ago. One of the most notable of his many noteworthy campaigns was the one held at Albany, N. Y., two or three years ago. Converts in a seven weeks' campaign there totalled approximately 14,000.

Mr. Richey has a record of remarkable achievement in the field of old-time evangelism. More than 175,000 men and women have "hit the sawdust trail" under his ministry in five years. In that time he has prayed for probably 17,000 persons for the healing of the body, with multiplied hundreds of miraculous healings reported. This intrepid preacher believes and preaches that the day of miracles is not past for the man or woman who believes God.

A. J. Richey, long identified with the Richey party as gospel song leader and musical director, and himself an evangelistic speaker of great success, will have charge of the music in the Titusville meeting.

Mrs. Raymond T. Richey and Mrs. A. J. Richey will be in the party.

## REMOVAL AT TITUSVILLE

Penitents bowed in the saw-dust to surrender to Jesus in each. Crowds have continued. It is wonderful to see how the friends are coming in from different cities. Visitors have been registered from Erie, Buffalo, Niagara Falls, Pittsburgh, Jamestown and other important Pennsylvania and New York cities. Mrs. A. J. Richey held the great audience Sunday night tense with a simple recital of the story of her healing from tuberculosis through the power of prayer when she was lying at the point of death. The evangelist is preaching with old-time fire, and big meeting is fully on. Mr. Richey says he has seen more than 175,000 persons hit the saw-dust trail under his ministry in five years. In the same period he has prayed for 125,000 men, women, and children for the healing of their bodies. Multiplied thousands have professed miraculous restoration to bodily health and vigor through the prayer of faith.
